
Which Posters Caught* Respondents' Attention

How The Posters Made People Feel


"Great! I am LGBTQ and my partner is trans, so I love seeing any support for trans people, especially in Utah. Trans people do belong in stem"

"Trans hate on campus. Transphobia affecting grades and attendance."


"ace/aro spectrum identities, wider variety of gender identities (agender, genderfluid, genderqueer, etc)"

On a scale of 1 (getting much worse) to 5 (getting much better) how do you feel the environment for LGBTQ+ individuals is on campus in the context of recent policies?




Do you have any comments / feedback about the environment for LGBTQ+ students on campus?
